Alberta's Heritage fund: A Norwegian perspective

Linda Nøstbakken, PhD

Linda Nøstbakken is Assistant Professor of Natural Resource Economics at the University of Alberta School of Business. She is originally from Norway, where she worked and lived until she joined the School of Business in July 2008. Dr Nøstbakken has a PhD in economics from the Norwegian School of Economics and Business Administration in Bergen, Norway. Her research focuses on the economics of natural resources, where she has done work on fisheries and oil, but also covers other areas of economics. In her talk, Dr Nøstbakken will take a critical look at Alberta's Heritage Fund by comparing to the Norwegian and Alaskan experience. Norway's Petroleum Fund, which was established in 1990, and the Alaska Permanent Fund established in 1976 provide good examples of how petroleum revenues are managed in other parts of the world.
